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Headmaster's Welcome



I am delighted that you are considering The Mall for your daughter or son.

Parents often ask me what makes this school different and why they should choose to educate their child here. I hope the reasons I outline below and the experience you have when you visit the school will show how we aim to bring out the best in your child.

At The Mall we seek to ignite the love of learning which can last a lifetime. Each child is unique and benefits from our personalised and individual approach to learning. That is because we are a school with personality, where each child is encouraged to be their own person. We believe that with confidence and curiosity, any child can overcome the challenges they face.

We are also the only school locally where children can join us from as early as 6 months old and stay with us to the age of 11 when they move on to their senior school. Since 1872 we have been at the heart of the Twickenham community; during this time over 2000 children have passed through our school and on to an excellent raise of selective schools with many awarded academic and non-academic scholarships.

We've embraced change, having rebuilt and expanded our facilities to include a beautiful theatre and much-loved swimming pool. We've responded to changes in the market, phasing out our 11 to 13 provision, launching a new day nursery and now we are welcoming girls into the school as we move to becoming fully co-educational. We also provide quality wraparound care 11 hours a day and 50 weeks a year.

I hope you will find the information in this guide useful and will answer your questions about the structure, admissions processes and wider provision we offer. However, to get a real insight into daily life inside and outside of the classrooms I encourage you to look at our website and follow our social media channels but most of all I hope – if you haven't already – that you will come and visit and let me, our children and staff introduce you to our school.



The Mall School and Nursery

Situated across two sites on Hampton Road in Twickenham, we are an independent school and nursery for children aged from 6 months to 11 years.

Our mission is to create an environment that ignites the love of learning in children, through passion, joy, confidence and happiness. We will achieve this by providing a supportive community and place to grow, where everyone has a voice. A place where true potential can be developed, whether it is academic, sporting, musical, dramatic or artistic.

In 2022 the school was inspected by the Independent Schools Inspectorate (ISI), and we were delighted and proud to be given the highest grading possible of 'Excellent' in the two key areas assessed – the quality of pupils' achievements and the quality of pupils' personal development.

The inspectors' key findings included:

- Pupils have excellent and highly developed communication skills.
- Pupils have an excellent attitude towards their learning and work with very high levels of engagement in their lessons.
- Pupils of all abilities make sustained, rapid progress.
- Pupils show highly developed social skills including the ability to collaborate very effectively with their peers.
- Pupils display excellent self-confidence, resilience and knowledge of their own strengths and weaknesses.
- Pupils are extremely well-mannered and show a high degree of respect for their school rules as they take responsibility for their own behaviour.









Nursery overview and admissions

Our day nursery can accommodate up to 75 babies, toddlers and pre-schoolers in five light, airy and age appropriate rooms, with caring, experienced and nurturing staff using the latest resources in early years education. The children have daily access to over 750m² of inspiring and imaginative outdoor space as well as a weekly swimming lesson in the school's indoor heated pool. Hot, freshly cooked food is prepared in the school's kitchens daily and children can stay for up to 12 hours a day across 51 weeks of the year.

Our baby rooms have plenty of resources to help their cognitive and physical development. There are cots for sleeping and dedicated play areas with fantastic play equipment for when they are more steady on their feet. In our younger toddler room there are mats for sleeping, dens for children to take time out of the hustle and bustle of the room and in all the rooms there are areas for cuddles and cosy time with a much loved book. Our pre-school rooms are equipped with lots of role-play toys and the room set up is more "grown-up" as they approach school age.


Our curriculum is based around each child's interests and their stage of development to ensure that children are ready for the next phase in their journey. Our focus in the preschool is that the children are emotionally ready for the transition to school with well-developed social and communication skills. We also introduce children to the more formal academic aspects of school, particularly with their early writing, early maths and early literacy skills.

Admission to our nursery is subject to availability of places and on a minimum attendance of three days a week. Our standard hours are 7.30am to 6.30pm. We advise early registration as places are allocated in order of receipt of the registration fee, not the start date at the nursery. For more information on fees and funding see page 13.



Joining The Mall School in Reception

Admission into Reception at the age of 4 is non-selective. All children who join Reception each September will automatically transfer through the school until they leave at the end of Year 6.

All children attending The Mall Nursery automatically receive an offer of a place in Reception.

For children not attending our nursery, we make Reception offers 18 months prior to start date with acceptance deposit due 12 months before start. The first 20 children registered for each year of entry will be guaranteed the offer of a place; all subsequent registrations will be placed on a waiting list.

If you would like your child to join us at age 4 from another nursery or childcare provider, we do recommend registering them as soon as possible as we are already receiving registrations for entry into the school between 2025-2027.

Key dates and timelines for external admissions (non-nursery):

- Reception 2024 entry: we are now filling remaining places in order of receipt of acceptance deposit, regardless of date of registration.
- Reception 2025 entry: we are currently accepting registrations and the first 20 received will receive an offer of a place on 1 March 2024.
- Reception 2026 entry: we are currently accepting registrations and the first 20 received will receive an offer of a place on 1 March 2025.
- Reception 2027 entry: we are currently accepting registrations and the first 20 received will receive an offer of a place on 1 March 2026.

Stay and Play, coffee mornings and Little Sparks events

All registered families will receive regular news and updates from the school and each year we hold a number of events for families to come into the school and start to get to know staff and each other. For pre-school aged children we hold termly Little Sparks events with a themed activity such as Christmas craft making or cake decorating. For younger children and their parents we have 'stay and play' coffee mornings. In the summer term prior to joining the school we hold a number of settling in events for children and parents.

Joining The Mall School in Years 1-5

We welcome children into the school at the start of Years 1 to 5 subject to availability of places and a successful assessment during a taster day with us. Once registered we will organise a convenient day for your child to come and spend the day with their class, taking part in their lessons as well as carrying out individual assessments in maths and English. We like the children to come in on a normal school day so that they can experience school life and we have plenty of time to get to know them in both classroom and social environments.

In September 2024, we anticipate having limited places for girls and boys to join in Year 1 and boys to join in Years 2 to 5.

In September 2025, subject to availability of places, we will accept registrations for girls and boys to join Years 1 and 2 and boys in Years 3 to 5.

In September 2026, subject to availability of places, we will accept registrations for girls and boys to join Years 1,2 and 3 and boys in Years 4 and 5.

Year 3 (7+) entry

For entry into the school in Year 3 in 2024 we will hold a group taster day for registered children in November 2023.

In-year admissions to Reception to Year 4

Children can join during the school year, subject to availability of places and a successful assessment during a taster day with us. Once registered we will organise a convenient day for your child to come and spend the day with one of their peer classes, taking part in their lessons as well as carrying out individual assessments in maths and English. We like the children to come in on a normal school day so that they can experience school life and we have plenty of time to get to know them in both classroom and social environments. School day and wraparound care

Our core nursery hours are 7.30am to 6.30pm with optional extensions at the start and end of the day on request and subject to additional charges.

Core school hours vary according to your child's year group. Wraparound care is available at the start and end of the day from 7.30am to 6.00pm.

The camp is a safe and engaging environment for everyone to spend time with friends, stay active, and have fun with the help of enthusiastic and high qualified activity professionals. We also host the Mother Nature Science Club.

















11+ Offers, Destinations and Awards 2019-2023

As a non-selective school for entry into Reception, we are very proud of the progress and academic achievement and outcomes of all our pupils when they leave at the end of Year 6. We regularly assess pupils to monitor their progress and our latest standardised data shows that 75% of Year 6 are in the top 25% nationally for reading, with 50% in the top 10%. In maths, 75% are in the top 15% nationally with 50% in the top 2%.

On average, half of pupils in a year group will go on to a highly academically selective school, either an independent co-educational or single-sex school or a state grammar school. We have excellent relationships with a wide range of schools and in our regular surveys, our parents rate the advice and preparation we give on future schools extremely highly.

Fees

Nursery Fees 2023-24

Nursery fees are reviewed annually. Fees for September 2024 - August 2025 will be published in June 2024.

Registration fee (non-refundable £95). Acceptance deposit £200.

The fees are for the nursery core opening hours of 7:30am to 6:30pm are:

Both 15 and 30 hours funding is based on 38 weeks of the year, giving eligible families 570 and 1140 hours respectively. To keep your payments to an equal monthly fee throughout the year, we 'stretch' this funding over the 51 weeks per year that we are open. This means you receive 11 hours 10 minutes or 22 hours 20 minutes every week of the year and don't receive a high bill outside of term time.

Additional care is charged at £5 per half an hour

Early starts from 7:00am and late finishes up to 7.00pm are available for £5 for one per day or £10 for both.

The fees are inclusive of:

- Breakfast, morning snack, lunch, tea and all refreshments
- Formula milk if required (for under one's only) and an individualised menu when they wean.
- Nappies, creams and wipes, including sun cream
- Swimming class

All major childcare vouchers are accepted.

Please note that there is a minimum booking requirement of three full-days.

Girls joining The Mall during the early stages of the move to co-education will be pioneers of a new development for the school, and to reflect this the Governors have decided that the girls joining Reception in 2023 and 2024 will receive appropriate fee discounts. Extra-curricular activities
