			Independent activity:  The children use a sponge print for the background of their artwork. They then use different shapes to create repeating patterns using traditional African colours.	
10	Africa	To create African Masks in the design of traditional African art.	Input Show the children a range of African tribal masks. Discuss how the masks were part of a ceremonial costume. Explain to the children that artists such as Pablo Picasso and Andre Derain were inspired by the designs of these masks and incorporated the designs into their own artworks – show the children examples of this. Explain to the children that they will be making their own African Tribal Mask. Model how to do this.	Completed African Masks.
			Independent activity:  The children make masks by using papier mache onto balloons and allowing them to dry. When their masks are dry the children can cut and add facial features as observed in traditional masks.
